<p>課程宗旨： Course Objectives</p> <p>This is an advanced English course, aiming to elevate students' English proficiency level to CEFR C1 while at the same time deepen their understanding of the important cultural, social, economic, and political issues around the world. In this course, issues related to the UN' s SDGs and other current global issues will be analyzed and discussed. As this course adopts a CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) approach, both language and content learning will be the foci of this course, with building and expanding theme-based and advanced lexicon as an objective. Students' English ability and knowledge on SDGs will both be expanded. This course aims to promote 4C' s for the 21st century, namely, communication, creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking as learning outcomes. Students are encouraged to exercise critical thinking and to discuss with one another and express their ideas and actively engage in exchange of opinions. Collaboration and group work are necessary for carrying the PBL tasks of this course. Throughout the course, there will be activities that promote efficient and effective oral and written communication skills.</p> <p>* Ethical use of AI for learning and academic integrity are fundamental to all assessment components of the course.
